
IN RE: GRAND JURY PRESENTMENT FOR THE NOVEMBER TERM 2016

**SUB-COMMITTEE OF THE NOVEMBER 2016 GRAND JURY  
REPORT ON THE CHARLES B. WEBSTER DETENTION CENTER**

On November 28, 2016, a Sub-Committee of six members of the Grand Jury visited the Charles B. Webster Detention Center (CBWDC). The Detention Center maximum capacity is 1,056 inmates. Current population is at 929. In 2010, the expansion project was completed and eventually in 2014, the entire operation was transferred to the CBWDC. We found the Detention Center to be very clean, thoroughly ventilated and well lit. It seems to be a safe and secure environment with a double door system to enhance security.

First, we checked in for clearance and met up with Captain Reeves, Captain White and Major Leverett for introduction purposes. Captain Reeves, the current operations manager, guided our tour with our initial stop in the cafeteria. To our surprise, we were served a delicious lunch.

We toured the intake and booking areas where the inmates are photographed and fingerprinted. All are processed through a security scanner before being placed in housing units. Placements are based upon a classification system for violent and non-violent offenders for both genders. We learned that violent offenders wear striped uniforms and those wearing solid uniforms are considered non-violent. Central Control oversees all activities within the various pods. All buildings are under video surveillance 24 hours a day. The area through which inmates are released is commonly referred to as the "walk of freedom." Inmate property is kept in the property room with individuals overseeing that process. Blue bags identify court clothes and orange bags hold personal clothes. Summer and winter clothes are recycled. Undergarments and socks are disposed.

Inmates seeking medical attention are customarily seen by medical staff the day after they make their needs known. Dental and medical services are provided for all inmates. The Detention Center is also able to secure assistance with mental health issues for the inmates. Nurses are on call 24 hours a day.

Our walk through included the Visitor Center. It is a building with the newest available technology in regard to visitation. Inmates are allocated three, thirty-minute visits each week through video conferencing. Also, defense attorneys and family members are able to hold more private sessions related to individual cases behind closed doors. Inmates have access to Smart Deposit. A system similar to an ATM and accessible on-line as well for family members to make deposits on behalf of the inmates. Family members may also watch certain court proceedings via CCTV.






