

Government Wide Small Business Goals FY 2016



What role does SBAplay?

Office of Veterans Business Development (OVBD)

- Promotes veteran entrepreneurship.
- Provide access to capital and preparation for small business opportunities.
 - Connect veteran small business owners with federal procurement and commercial supply chains.
- May 1, 2018, GA Veterans Education Career Transition Resource (VECTR) Center hosts the GA and SC Veterans Business Outreach Center (VBOC)
 - VECTR state-wide and a natural fit to establish the VBOC within VECTR
 - Program is designed as a one-stop-shop for transitioning service members, veterans, and military spouses looking to start, purchase or grow a business.

SDVOB Program: Who is Eligible?

Ownership:

 Must be at least 51% directly and unconditionally owned and controlled by one or more service- disabled veterans

Serviced-Disabled Vet must manage the day to day!

Documentation:

- Rating Letter from VA
- DD-214 indicating honorable discharge



What is a "NAICS Code"?e"?

ANAICS code is the **North American Industry Classification System** number listed in the NAICS Manual which is published by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB). The NAICS Manual is available at your *local library* or *on the Internet site*

What is a "NAICS Code"?

NAICS codes are used by the Federal Government to identify and classify specific categories of business activity that represent the primary line of business of a firm. SBAsize standards are based on NAICS codes.



What is a "NACS Code"?e"?

Computer software support services, Custom 541511 Janitorial services 561720 Commercial building construction general 236220 contractors

SDVOB Program: Who is Eligible?



Must be small according to SBAsize standards:

- Manufacturing 500 up to 1,500 employees
- Wholesale Trades Up to 100 employees
- Services \$2 Million to \$35.5 Million Average Annual Receipts
- Retail Trades \$7 Million to \$35.5 Million Average Annual Receipts
- Construction \$7 Million to \$33.5 Million Average Annual Receipts
- Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting \$750 Kto \$17 Million in Average Annual Receipts

Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business (SDVOB) Program

Self-certifying program; Exception – Veterans Administration, which requires Registration in www.va.gov/osdbu.gov

SDVOBs are eligible to bid on set-aside contracts/Sole Source Contract wards

Shall submit a acceptable subcontracting plan:

> Acquisitions (Negotiated and sealed bidding) > \$700,000 (\$1.5 million for construction)

Prime contractors get credit towards small business goals for using SDVOBs as subcontractors



Veterans First Verification Program

- This is a program that targets Veteran/SD-Veteran-owned small businesses seeking contracts with the VA: The requirements are:
 - ➤ Unconditional ownership of 51%, or more, of the business
 - ➤ Hold the highest title within the company
 - > Be paid the highest salary
 - Must manage the day-to-day company operations
 - Must be the ultimate decision-maker on day-to-day, as well as long term company operational decisions



Navigating the U.S. Veterans Administration (VA) Veterans Verification Process

- What is VAVerification Processfor?
 - > The VAis obligated by Federal Regulations to "VERIFY" the status of a Veteran or SD-Vet-owned small business
 - The Vendor Information Pages (VIP) is where you will start this process within the VAwebsite, or www.va.gov/osdbu.gov
 - ➤ A'Certified Verification Evaluator' within the VAwill <u>evaluate</u> and <u>verify</u> the solicitor is a Vet or SD-Vet-owned small business
 - > You can refer to 38 CFRPart 74 of the FARfor more information
 - > The Verification program requirement applies to the U.S. VA and U.S. FAA, only
 - Every 2 years you must re-verify with the VAor FAA, and every 4 years you must start the VAor FAA Verification process all over again
