B. Project Name / Brief Description:

Several offices and departments use Mobile Data Terminals (MDTs) to perform essential law enforcement functions. In order to remain compliant with Georgia Criminal Information Center (GCIC) and National Crime Information Center (NCIC) guidelines, Augusta must replace these devices on a regular cycle. These replacements ensure that each device remains on an operating system new enough to receive required security-related updates and patches. In addition to security concerns, aging devices become less reliable and more difficult to support, as parts are more difficult to locate. This project would continue the eight-year replacement cycles initiated with the MDT Replacement project in SPLOST 7.

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G. Project Classification Public Safety

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I. PROJECT JUSTIFICATION:

A. Project Mission Statement / Goals & Objectives:

The goal of this project is to ensure the continued reliability and functionality of the approximately 383 Mobile Data Terminals (MDTs) used by the Richmond County Sheriff's Office, Marshal's Office, Fire Department and Animal Services Department. As more functions are automated, each agency's dependence on these devices has increased. When an MDT fails, the ability of the officer or first responder to access critical information, receive dispatches and complete reports is significantly reduced, which in turn affects Augusta's overall public safety. These devices operate in a hostile environment of extreme heat, cold and vibration and must be replaced regularly.

B. How will this project help meet the Public Safety, Basic Facilities / Infrastructure, and/or Quality of Life needs in

This project has a significant daily impact on public safety throughout Augusta. The reliability of the MDT hardware directly impacts the ability of officers and first responders in the Sheriff's Office, Marshal's Office, Fire Department and Animal Services to perform their daily duties. In addition, maintaining Georgia Criminal Information Center (GCIC) and National Criminal Information Center (NCIC) compliance is required for continued access to the critical data these agencies provide. MDT replacements are necessary to remain in compliance with the system requirements set forth by these agencies.

C. Why should this project be considered for SPLOST type funding?

SPLOST funding allows these necessary replacements to be scheduled and completed on a predictable multi-year basis, without the constraints associated with annual capital fund requests. The SPLOST 7 project allowed the previous round of replacements to be phased in on a schedule that minimized operating impact to officers (as well as IT support capacity).

Replacing these Mobile Data Terminals (MDTs) will positively impact the ability of the Richmond County Sheriff's Office, Marshal's Office, Fire Department and Animal Services to provide essential law enforcement and public safety services. As these devices reach end of life, replacement parts are frequently not available and repairs become increasingly difficult, when possible at all. In addition to providing more reliable technology, the replacement MDTs have increased functionality, speed, memory and storage.

B. Positive / Negative Impacts on existing Infrastructure / Systems:

All impact on existing infrastructure will be positive. The frequency of equipment failure will be reduced. The time required to repair a device, when failure does occur, will be reduced. System upgrades will be possible to maintain compliance with state and federal agencies. The reliability and functionality of these devices will be significantly increased.

C. Positive / Negative Impacts on Augusta Richmond County Tax Base:

Replacement of these aging MDTs is necessary to maintain and enhance the current service levels to which ARC's tax base has become accustomed. The increased speed, functionality and reliability of new equipment ensures officers' ability to provide essential services. In addition, maintaining up-to-date equipment and operating systems allow for the implementation of emerging technology that was previously not available, allowing each agency to pursue innovative tools that promote public safety.
