Commissioner Francine Scott appointed to National League of Cities' 2022 Finance, Administration and Intergovernmental Relations Federal Advocacy Committee

AUGUSTA, GA (Jan. 6, 2022) – Commissioner Francine Scott has been appointed to the [National League of Cities](#) (NLC) 2022 Finance, Administration and Intergovernmental Relations (FAIR) Federal Advocacy Committee. Scott was elected to a one-year term and will provide strategic direction and guidance for NLC's federal advocacy agenda and policy priorities. The appointment was announced by NLC President Mayor Vince Williams of Union City, Georgia.
